About the City

Panipat is a historical city in the state of Haryana, India. It falls in the NCR region, and is only 90 km north of our National Capital, Delhi. The state capital, Chandigarh is 169 km north of Panipat. The city is very well connected through road and rail network, and is traversed by National Highway 44, the erstwhile GT Road. Nearest Airports are situated in New Delhi and Noida. Historically, the three battles of Panipat were fought in the years 1526, 1556 and 1761, which were significant turning points in the Indian history. Not only through history, the city holds a significant niche through its trade also. This is the very famous "City of Weavers" and "Textile City", also known as the "cast-off capital" due to being "the global centre for recycling textiles". It has a multicultural and employability setup due to some major industrial establishments like IOCL Refinery, NFL, Thermal Power Plant etc.

The city of Panipat has some places of tourist attraction also, like the eminent and old holy place of the Muslim saint Shaikh Sharafuddeen Bu Ali Qalandar, war museum, and memorials of battle grounds. The weather in the post-monsoonal month of September is generally warm and humid.

About the Conference

The march to 2047 is not just a temporal leap, but a transformative journey from a nation of possibility to a nation of actualisation. In this Amrit Kaal, the 25 years before India turns 100, it must become a high-income nation while operating in an uncertain global environment marked by climate change and geopolitical turmoil. This conference aims to be a forge for melding the Viksit Bharat (Developed India) narrative with the global agenda of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The "Concept" suggests that an Atmanirbhar (Self-Reliant) Bharat is needed to emerge as a Vishwa Guru (Global Leader), and that a country can only lead the world by addressing its problems internally, through local innovation and just distribution. Central to this is a new social compact for the four demographic pillars: Yuva (Youth), Garib (Poor), Mahilayen (Women) and Annadata (Farmers). The transition from developing to developed economy is from "welfare" to "empowerment-led development". For the Yuva, this means a complete revamp of the education-to-employment ecosystem to transform the demographic dividend into a global talent pool for the Fourth Industrial Revolution. For the Annadata, the goals shift from food security to income security through climate-proofed agriculture and global value chain connect. Finally and importantly, the dream of Nari Shakti (Women-led Development) extends beyond gender equality to female empowerment as authors of the economic story, as a \$30 trillion economy can only be built with their contribution. By prioritising development for these four groups, "Viksit" status is no longer an elite-driven destination but a grassroots reality, delivering on Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas (Together with all, Development for all). As India heads towards 2047, this conference will discuss India's domestic successes in sectors such as health, digital inclusion, and poverty eradication and how they can be packaged as "Global Public Goods". The conference will deliberate on the concept that the culmination of strong, resilient and self dependent Bharat is its transformation into a vishwagruru, leading by example and sharing its wisdom for the benefit of others.

- Abstract must not be of more than 500 words accompanied with 4-5 keywords. The length of the full paper should be between 6000-8000 words including tables, graphs, figures and references typed in Times New Roman. ([Sample Abstract](#))
- References should be provided in 'American Psychological Association' (APA) style.
- If the paper gets accepted for presentation, at least one author will have to present the paper in either online or offline mode.
- All the authors of a paper will have to register for the conference.
- All the papers will be reviewed by the experts in the field and the organisers will try to provide the publishing opportunities for the good papers. A nominal processing charge will have to be paid by the authors of the shortlisted manuscripts.
- A Best Paper Award (including a certificate of appreciation and a memento) will be conferred upon one exceptional paper within each thematic track.
